Approval of agenda

Creekview Preserve discussion

Keller highlighted the survey results for Creekview. Highlights include:

- 121 responses
- 40% of respondents indicated they live in Creekview neighborhood
- 75% of respondents thought playground upgrades were important (#1 priority)
- 2nd highest priority was more picnic tables (44%)
- 3rd highest priority was pathway connecting to sidewalk (43%)
- Other comments ranged from: splash pad, b-ball court, more swings, more mulch, amenities for older children.

Park Commission discussed the survey results and viewed the park as a very nice neighborhood park. The playground equipment is slightly larger than the average neighborhood park playground, the green space offers free play options for older kids, and the park appears to be in very good condition considering the age of the equipment. Kothenbeutel also pointed out that more mulch was added to the surfacing.

Public Works update

Kothenbeutel provided updates on the following:

- Shade structures will be added at the following parks: Fox Run, Huntington, and Madison Crossing
- New full court versa court at Wilds Park
- Benches added to Celebration pond
- Mulch added to various parks throughout the City

City updates

Keller updated the Commission on the following:

- Successful grant request for Watab Creek Park. Grant will allow City to construct new restroom facility, rehab wading pool, new playground (residents will get to vote on new playground from 3 pre-selected designs) and resurfacing of tennis courts. Courts will be resurfaced with versa court, one tennis court will be eliminated so the City can add one pickleball and one half-court basketball in its place.
